President's Message

September is the beginning of the administrative year here at the Bethesda-Chevy Chase Chapter. No beginning would be complete without recognition of those who have served in the past. Speaking for myself, and the membership, we are grateful for the time and energy expended by last year's President, Steven Swartz. Steven will now serve in the office of Past President in which he can continue to contribute to the vitality of the Chapter. He will be a valuable source of knowledge and provide continuity to projects that will continue through the coming months.

Thank you for your work Steven! Good job!!

The Chapter had a busy year and accomplished a great deal through the energy of its Committee Chairs and the Board of Governors. Notable among these was:

- the purchase of the 2nd NE land property in the NE sector of the farm,
- the completion of the Natural Resources Inventory/Forest Stand Delineation (NRI/FSD),
- the sale of 3 Transferrable Development Rights (TDRs) which by formal agreement automatically go to the Legacy Foundation to pay off land purchase debt,
- the completion of the approximately 18 month effort to develop the new Conservation Farm Guide which is in the process of being printed,
- the completion of the major farm projects that have been in progress over the past few years,
- the construction of the Rifle and Pistol Range tire wall backstop,
- the development and implementation of a method of financial management which will allow Chapter prioritization and funding of Capital Asset purchases and maintenance,
- the emergency acquisition and installation of the gate/building entrance card reader system,
- completion of another phase of the major tree planting effort that has been ongoing over recent years,
- substantially completed work to rehabilitate the log cabin,
- taught another 80 Poolesville High School students during their annual outdoor class in our West Woods.

By any standard, the above list is impressive. It shows energy, commitment, and thoughtful, deliberate management by volunteers dedicated to common principles. The Mission and Core Values are framed and hung in the chapter house. If you haven't read them, I encourage you to do so at your convenience.

Our Chapter runs on the strength of its volunteer spirit. As we begin the year, I encourage all members to review their current participation, and, determine if there are any new areas in which they can make a contribution.

Every fall and spring, the Chapter holds a member "work day" to keep the farm in a decent state of repair. The "work day" will be held on October 5th and as is traditionally the case, our 1st Vice President organizes the work to be done and assigns member to various teams in the most effective way. The process begins by the various Committee and Board of Governors members pooling their observations of work that needs to be done on the farm and to the buildings. If you see work that you think needs attention, send an email to our 1st Vice President, Joe Snider. Once Joe compiles the list he will then organize the work to be done and beginning at 8:30 a.m. on October 5, he will assign volunteering "IKes" (nickname for members of the League) to the various tasks.

If you have special skills or tools that you think will be valuable, please let Joe know about them. As is our tradition, we will have a lunchtime feed for all those who volunteer. The lunch is usually staggered as different work crews finish at different times depending on the work they are doing. Please make an effort to join in the fun. It's a great way to get to know fellow members, contribute to our shared goals and document your required volunteer hours.

Earlier this year the Archeology Committee was formed to organize research into the cultural history associated with the land our Chapter now resides upon. Our property encompasses two abandoned farms, one of which dates from the late 1700's and was a large slave-holding farm. In the West Woods there's a deep hole tentatively identified as possibly being an abandoned gold mine. In addition we've found evidence that this area has been popular with hunters for thousands of years. Because of this history, artifacts of various sorts are scattered throughout the woods and fields. If you happen to stumble upon something, for example an old glass bottle or perhaps a curiously shaped stone, please don't pick it up! Its' location is a valuable clue. Mark the area in some way, and report the finding to the Archeology Committee. And please remember that all objects found here are Chapter property.

The B-CC IWLA Board of Governors, in their monthly meeting last week, approved a rules change that affects all our members who discharge firearms in the process of training dogs.

Going forward, no guests are allowed to discharge firearms in the process of training dogs, even though they are escorted by members.

More precisely, guests to the B-CC IWLA Conservation Farm may only discharge firearms on the property if they are on, and they are in accordance with the rules of, the Rifle-Pistol Range and the Shotgun Range.

This new restriction must be implemented for the same insurance reasons that guests are not permitted to hunt on chapter property.

All dog training that does NOT include the use or discharge of firearms remains unaffected by this rules change.

Course of Fire:

Stage 0, Prone,
As many Sighting-In Shots as needed, 15 Minutes

Stage 1, Prone,
1 String of 10 Shots, 10 Minutes, MR-31 Target

Stage 2, Prone,
1 String of 10 Shots with a reload, 70 Seconds, SR-21 Target

Stage 3, Standing (Offhand)
1 String of 10 Shots, 10 Minutes, SR-1 Target

Note: All targets will be located at 100 yards. The prone position strings will be completed from the bench top. The shootist has the option of lying on the bench top in the prone position or seated at a bench with only their elbows and stomach on the bench top.

Rifle: Any centerfire rifle with OPEN sights. Slings are allowed. No zooming optical sights are allowed. **There WILL be loaner M1 Garands available for this match IF you do not have a rifle fit for this competition**

Stage 3, 2 Strings of 5 Shots Each, 10 Seconds/String,
B-8 Target at 25 Yards

Note: THE 50-YARD SHOOTING IS DONE TWO HANDED AND THE 25-YARD IS DONE ONE HANDED.
